We strongly recommend students to book accommodation before arrival.

For a stay of 1 month and more, a guarantee deposit of $750.00 \in$ is requested, debited from your account and refunded 60 days after your departure. For a stay between 7 and 30 nights, a deposit of $245 \in$ will be requested and refunded at the departure after the inventory of fixtures. You need to add a tax of $0.85 \in$ per day.

HOUSING BENEFIT FROM THE CAF

The **French Caisse d'Allocations Familiales (C.A.F)** grants a monthly amount to help students pay their housing in France. It is automatically granted to students who are from E.U. Non E.U. students may receive - or not - this housing benefit depending on the type of visa. In any case, upon arrival they should submit their file to the CAF which will inform them whether or not they are entitled to receive the housing benefit. This housing benefit ("Aide pour le Logement - **APL**") is subject to income conditions. As soon as you have your definitive housing address in France, apply for it on-line at http://www.gironde.caf.fr.

Once your application is accepted, the amount will be transferred on your bank account in France. It can only be backdated three months and the first month is never granted.

Requested documents to apply (subject to change):

- Income statement of the previous year (to fill in upon arrival);
- A copy of your rental contract (or ask your owner to fill in the special CAF form);
- A school certificate "certificat de scolarité" or a copy of your student ID;
- Bank identification (RIB) of your bank account in France;
- A copy of your residence permit ("carte de séjour") or the renewal receipt ("récépissé de renouvellement") (not needed for E.U. students).

The CAF calculates the amount of Housing Benefit according to different factors:

- Rent
- Number of occupants in the apartment
- Income of the ocupants in the apartment
- Location and size of the housing

You will receive a confirmation letter from the CAF at your address in Bordeaux.



A FEW TIPS

Rental contract

The rental contract ("bail" or "contrat de location") describes the apartment, the rent, how and when the rent should be paid and revised, the amount of the deposit and the date on which the lease begins. Two copies are made and signed by the landlord and the tenant (that's you). The landlord should send a receipt for each rental payment made. This is necessary not only as proof of payment, but also to give you the proof of where you are living ("justification de domicile"), so frequently requested by the administrative services (to obtain the residence permit "carte de séjour", to open a bank account and so on)...

The inventory of fixtures ("état des lieux") prior to moving in, a complete inventory of the contents and the condition of the property is established between the landlord (or his agent) and the tenant). This inventory is signed by both parties and each keeps a copy. This is an important document as it meticulously describes the state of the apartment on entry, and will refer to when the tenant leaves the property. This inventory has to be done when you arrive and when you leave the apartment.

The deposit ("depôt de garantie"), is equivalent to one months' rent, and kept by the landlord until the tenant leaves the apartment. It is returned after all money owing on the apartment has been paid (rent, repairs, utilities, etc...).

If there is any damage, the deposit is used to pay for any necessary repairs or cleaning. Pay attention to all the details (broken furniture or damaged walls) because you will be charged (on your guarantee "caution") for any differences!

Warning:

- If you rent a furnished apartment, the rental agreement is for one year but can be dismissed by a registered letter ("lettre avec accusé de reception") 1 month prior to your departure and should specify that the apartment is furnished.
- If you rent a non-furnished apartment, the rental agreement usually is of 3 years but can be dismissed by a registered letter ("lettre avec accusé de réception") 3 months prior to your departure (read very carefully your rental contract it must be written on it).

Things to know beforehand

- You will need to find a furnished apartment or you will need to buy furniture (you can always sell it back to the other exchange students the following semester).
- If possible, try to avoid the Estate Agencies, as they that will charge you a lot (in any case, show your student ID card and try to negotiate the fees), try to deal directly with owners.
- Do not forget to ask if the utilities (heat, hot water, cold water, waste, elevator) are included or not in the rent. If not, be aware that you will have additional bills. If the rent is 380 € TTC, it means that all the operating costs are included. If the rent is 350 € + 45 € CC, it means a rent of 350 € and 45 € for operating costs for a total cost of 395 € / month. Always ask exactly which are the operating costs included in the rent to avoid nasty surprises!
- A studio is a room from 18 to 30 m2 with a small kitchen & bathroom. Price: around 300
 - 400 €/month.
- An F2 or T2 is a two-room apartment (living room and bedroom) with a bathroom & kitchen. Price: around 400/500 € / month.
- If you intend to book a room in a hotel, per day, you will pay a minimum of 40 € per day.
- Rent is to be paid in advance, usually before the 5th of the month by check or bank transfer. In addition to the first month's rent, you will often have to make a deposit of 1 month of rent as a guarantee deposit (*"caution"*); it will be handed back provided that you leave the apartment in good condition. In the event of repairs, the cost will be deducted from your deposit. NB Although it is a security deposit, that amount will be debited from your account. You must have enough funds!

Useful Abbreviations

- CC or Cc: charges comprises, operating costs included
- TCC: toutes charges comprises, all costs included
- T1 or F1: the number after the T or F indicates the number of rooms in the apartment (except bathroom & kitchen)
- RDC: rez-de-chaussée, ground-floor
- SDB: salle de bains, bath-room
- SDE: douche, shower
