You will be billed \$30 per month for this international health insurance. All students who attend a French Institutions are also required to purchase French Health Insurance which will cost approximately 195 Euros/semester. Student should anticipate spending an estimated 800 Euros (roughly \$1,120) during the semester on the expenses listed below plus round-trip airfare. Please note, these expenses could vary greatly depending on the individual student's spending habits, restaurant choices, personal shopping, additional weekend travel plans, etc.

Reims School of Management (RMS)

- RMS offers a wide range of management courses taught in English and in French throughout the academic year.
- This semester exchange is appropriate for those students Majoring in Business Administration or International Business
- USD students may only participate in this program during the SPRING SEMESTER.
- Students who are proficient in French may be eligible to stay over the summer and be placed in an internship.

Course Information:

All exchange students will enroll in the following four courses and select one elective:

- 1. French language (placed at appropriate level after testing, including beginning)
- 2. Management in a European context
- 3. Cross-cultural Management
- 4. Integrated Management (Business simulation game)
- 5. 1 of 3 electives (Luxury Marketing, Finance Elective, Entrepreneurship)



Bordeaux Management School (BEM)

- At BEM 25% of students are international, representing 44 different nationalities.
- Courses are offered in both English and French.
- BEM appears in the international ranking of the 50 best Masters in Management carried out by the Financial Times in 2010

Course Information:

Courses in Bordeaux are divided into six 3-week sessions.
Students take one course per session.



EM Strasbourg School of Management

- Students who attend the EM Strasbourg Business School may take business courses in English as well as cultural courses taught in basic French designed for non-native French speakers.
- Extra-curricular activities are an integral part of the EM Strasbourg Business School program and provide students with the chance to express themselves fully outside the classroom or lecture-hall context.
- Extra-curricular activities in the EM Strasbourg Spirit benefit from teacher backing and allow students to work together (and individually) and test out their professional, social and relational abilities within team-based projects.

Course Information:


- Courses at EM Strasbourg typically transfer back to USD as only 1.5 or 2 units per class.
- Therefore, students may need to enroll in 8-10 courses in order to remain as full time students.
- However, many courses offered transfer back to USD as the same course title so a student may be able to enroll in two separate courses that transfer back as 1.5 credits of MGMT 494 (for example) giving them a total of 3 units in MGMT 494.




Important Information to Note

- **ATTENTION French Minors:** A minimum of 6 upper division French units must be taken on the USD campus
- **ATTENTION French Majors:** A minimum of 15 upper division French units must be taken on the USD campus
- Only 2 Communication Courses can be taken abroad
- **494 Special Topics** courses can be taken multiple times as long as the course title is different (ie: POLS 494 can be Comparative Law & also EU Policies & Institutional Framework)
- All students covered by international insurance
- Double check all prerequisites before submitting applications (Business & Spanish especially)


